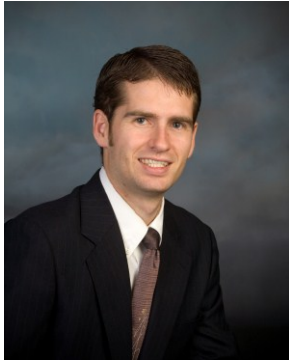


RANDY M. BRAEGGER



Mr. Braegger received a Bachelor's degree in 2004 from Brigham Young University, where he studied Japanese and Physics. Mr. Braegger received a Juris Doctor degree from the University of Utah, S.J. Quinney College of Law in 2008. Mr. Braegger has completed additional studies in undergraduate and masters level physics courses at the University of Utah in areas including optics, electrical engineering, and error analysis. Mr. Braegger also earned a diploma for Japanese Studies at Tsukuba University in Japan.

During law school, Mr. Braegger was the recipient of the CALI Excellence for the Future award in multiple areas of study and was additionally a recipient of a College of Law Outstanding Achievement Award. Prior to law school, Mr. Braegger received the prestigious *Monbukagakusho* scholarship from the Japanese Government and was an ORCA scholar at Brigham Young University. Mr. Braegger is fluent in Japanese and has some proficiency and understanding in other Asian and European languages and cultures.
